We invite you to continue or start the tradition of having an Advent wreath in your home. The advent wreath has a rich meaning. The circle of the wreath, with no beginning or end, symbolises the eternity of God. The evergreen reminds us of the everlasting life we have in Christ while any pine cones or pods in the wreath represent new life and resurrection. The four candles represent the four Sundays of Advent. Purple is traditionally a colour of penance and prayer while the rose-pink candle that is lit on the Third Sunday (Gaudete/Rejoice Sunday) marks our joy as we move ever closer to Christmas. Each Sunday in Advent we light another candle. As the winter grows darker, the light of the Advent wreath increases - reminding us that the light of Christ overcomes and dispels the darkness of our world. As you light a candle on your Advent wreath for the first time, pray the prayer of blessing and take a moment to talk to God about how you will keep Advent this year alone or as a household. Finish your time of prayer with the Advent prayer
